### GAe Engineering and Generali Group - Generali Tower is presented with an International Safety Award for protecting its employees from the risk of injury and ill health at work

GAe Engineering and Generali Group - Generali Tower has won an International Safety Award with a Merit from the British Safety Council in recognition of its commitment to keeping its workers and workplaces healthy and safe during the 2020 calendar year.

GAe Engineering and Generali Group - Generali Tower is one of 155 organisations to win a Merit in the International Safety Awards 2021.

Now in their 63rd year, the [International Safety Awards](#) recognise and celebrate organisations from around the world which have demonstrated to the satisfaction of the scheme's independent judges their commitment to preventing workplace injuries and work-related ill health during the previous calendar year. The awards also recognise organisations that have shown commitment to wellbeing and mental health at work.

In 2021, 387 organisations won an International Safety Award. They span all sectors with significant representation from the construction, manufacturing, oil, gas and mining, and power and utility sectors. Winners were drawn from 37 countries worldwide. 85 organisations were awarded a Distinction, 155 organisations were awarded a Merit and 147 organisations achieved a Pass.

Mike Robinson, Chief Executive of the British Safety Council, congratulated GAe Engineering and Generali Group - Generali Tower on their success in winning an International Safety Award 2021 with a Merit: "The British Safety Council applauds GAe Engineering and Generali Group - Generali Tower on their achievement. The award is in recognition of their commitment and hard work to keep their employees and workplaces free of injury and ill health.

"The vision of the British Safety Council is that *no-one should be injured or made ill through their work* – anywhere in the world. Achieving this requires more than complying with legislation; it means people committed not only to health and safety but also more and more to workplace wellbeing and impelling others to follow suit.

#### **About the International Safety Awards scheme**

The [International Safety Awards](#) are open to organisations of all types, sizes and sectors in the UK and internationally, both members of the British Safety Council and non-members, and relate to the health and safety management at a specific site or business unit.

Applicants must answer a series of online questions about their management of health and safety risks during the previous year which are assessed by a team of independent chartered health and safety professionals. If the application meets the required standard, a pass, merit or – for exceptional submissions – a distinction is awarded.

Selected high scoring winning organisations are shortlisted for additional ‘Sector Awards’ recognising outstanding sites and business units in up to 13 individual business sectors, as judged by the independent adjudicators.

The International Safety Awards scheme also features two awards to recognise exceptional individual performance of non-health and safety professionals who played a significant role keeping their work colleagues safe and healthy. These are the Health and Safety Champion of the Year Award, for personnel aged 25 or over, and the Young Health and Safety Champion of the Year Award, for personnel aged 16-24.

These allow organisations applying for an International Safety Award to nominate individual employees who have gone the extra mile to help protect the health, safety and welfare of their colleagues and others.

The winners of the Sector Awards and the Health and Safety Champion and Young Health and Safety Champion of the Year, as well as the awards for Team of the Year Award and Bravery Award, will be announced on 4 May 2021.

While there is no International Safety & Mates in Mind Awards Gala Dinner once again this year, we are making plans and look forward to welcoming you to our Gala Dinner in June 2022 to celebrate your success through such challenging times.
